Killed by enemy action at her home at 1 Clifton Gardens, Cliftonville on 14th November 1940. She was aged 50. *Interred at Margate Cemetery*

Mrs Kate Catherine Jane Kyley

Killed by enemy action at her home at 50 Victoria Avenue, Margate on 31st October 1942. She was aged 73.
